Archaeological Summary for the Parish of Bransford

This document contains your Historic Environment Record search. The following pages will provide an archaeological summary of the buildings and monuments within your parish, sorted by period. This is followed by an overview of our service alongside an explanation of the documentation included and guidance on its use. The appendix to this document includes the historic and modern mapping for your parish, the record lists organised by period and the full records providing detailed information.

An HER search was carried out for the parish of Bransford on 17/02/2016. 62 records were identified for the parish including, 26 Buildings, 26 Monuments and 10 other records pertaining to the Historic Environment.

Within the search area lie 7 Listed Historic Buildings and a further 19 unlisted historic buildings. A Historic England funded project to identify the Historic Farmsteads of Worcestershire also recorded 7 historic farmsteads and 1 out farm within the parish. Only 3 of the existing buildings were constructed prior to the 17th century, the church St John the Baptist has origins in the 13th century and two farmhouses date to the 1400s. The majority of historic buildings surviving within Bransford parish date to the 17th and 18th centuries and include a number of farmsteads and two public houses. Bransford Mill and Bransford House are both recorded as 19th century buildings. A hop kiln and hoppers huts dating to the 19th and early 20th century also exist and may indicate hop agriculture as important in this region during this period. The introduction of the railway in the 19th century is also recorded here as well as several further farmstead buildings. The Historic Buildings of Worcestershire project recorded 64 standing buildings within the parish that were also extant on the 1st edition OS Map. Although these buildings are not all recorded on the HER a map of their location points has also been provided. Please note that for many parishes these points have not yet been verified on the ground and it is highly possible that buildings have been demolished and replaced by a modern building with a similar footprint.

The earliest archaeological deposits within the parish are two geological members with the potential for archaeology dating back to the Palaeolithic period, 476050 BC. No other prehistoric evidence is recorded. In the medieval period the site of a shrunken village and manor house are recorded within the parish, as well as a moated site, bridge and watermill. The manor house at Brace's Leigh is first mentioned in 1316 and was held to Elmley Castle, whilst the bridge is known to have been built in 1338 by the Bishop of Worcester Wulstan de Bransford but was destroyed during the civil war.

Few further archaeological monuments are recorded for later periods aside from the site of a number of 19th century farmsteads and 7 records related to the defence of Worcestershire during the Second World War which was heavily focused on defending the Bransford Railway Bridge.

Finally, within the parish boundaries a number of Historic England Designated Assets are also recorded. These sites, monuments and buildings are already protected under planning policy and therefore other undesignated heritage should have a stronger focus within your neighbourhood plan.

- *There are 7 Historic England Listed buildings within the Parish of Bransford. No Scheduled Monuments or Registered battlefields or parks are currently recorded.**

* Heritage Assets are designated by Historic England. It is possible that the HER is out of date. NB. Other statutory designations may apply to your site which the HER does not record, such as Sites of Special Scientific Interest.

Information about the data sent to you

The Worcestershire **Historic Environment Record** (HER) is the largest collection of archaeological information in the County with details of over 45,000 sites, buildings, finds, and landscapes alongside information on past archaeological research and investigations. These records hold information on a vast and diverse array of archaeological remains, from Iron Age Hillforts to Second World War pillboxes. The HER is held in a database linked to a Geographical Information System (GIS), a computer mapping system designed to allow users to collect, manage and analyse large volumes of spatially referenced data. When you request information from us we carry out a search around a grid reference or criteria supplied by you, withdrawing all the records within that area from the database and allowing us to produce reports and mapping which fulfil your requirements. Our standard search radius is 500m from your specified location; however, we are able to undertake searches of more defined extents if requested. We are also able to provide information for records of particular types or dates such as a search for Neolithic enclosures.

The Historic Environment Record can be an ideal starting point if you are interested in researching your local area or a particular period of Worcestershire's past. While we can provide reports in digital format or by post, we encourage you to visit us in person to examine the large quantities of additional information stored in our offices, including banks of filing cabinets with detailed information on thousands of sites, and hundreds of aerial photographs covering large swathes of the county. In addition, the service has a reference library with general and specialist texts on British archaeology alongside an online collection of archaeological reports regarding Worcestershire's heritage accessible at www.worcestershire.gov.uk/archaeology/library. Finally, many of the archaeologists working at our offices are very knowledgeable about particular places, or are specialists in certain subjects or periods and are keen to help independent researchers.

The potential value of our records to your research may not however be restricted to an initial assessment of a particular area. We believe an appreciation of the historic form of landscapes is vital to understanding the people that occupied them; allowing us to contextualise and therefore improve our understanding of past activity. Our records and historic mapping can be used to understand these historic environments providing either fresh perspectives upon people and places identified through documentary research, or reconstructing historic landscapes to be populated through further research. Parish Searches for Neighbourhood Plans

This search has been prepared especially for use in putting together a neighbourhood plan. Worcestershire's Parishes all contain a substantial amount of historic environment data and we understand it can be difficult to digest. The archaeological summary provided attempts to highlight significant archaeological features of your parish, by period. However, it is important to remember that the Neighbourhood plan should be focused on identifying the undesignated heritage in the parish that is *important to the people who live there*. The HER was set up as a planning tool 30 years ago and contained the minimum level of data. Since then the records have been added to and enhanced over the years as more information has come to light. The records, therefore, vary greatly in their detail and accuracy. We are constantly updating and improving these records, however, they are compiled from a range of sources of varying quality and the information they contain should not be seen as definitive. We cannot accept responsibility for the accuracy of any information supplied and the user must accept that information may be outdated or inaccurate. The HER search results will remain valid for 3 months only from the date of production, because the HER is constantly being updated as new sites of archaeological importance are identified.

When information is provided in advance of metal detecting, the detectorist must agree to report detailed information for all finds, including an eight or ten figure grid reference, to the Portable Antiquities Scheme (via Angie Bolton, Finds Liaison Officer for Worcestershire and Warwickshire on 01905 25371 or abolton@worcestershire.gov.uk)

The HER Data and Documentation

This document contains two types of report:

The Single Line or Short Report – this provides the basic information: the WSM Number, the Name/Title of the Record, the monument type, the date range and finally the National Grid Reference (the WSM number is the unique number given to each record within the HER).

The Full Report – this provides the above information **plus** a more detailed description of the monument/site/find/fieldwork etc. It also contains the sources and references that the record is based upon and gives its relationship (if any) to other associated sites. A ‘full’ report is not definitive and all sources mentioned should be consulted to gain a full understanding of the record. Each source has a unique SWR number which can be used to locate it within our offices or within our online library www.worcestershire.gov.uk/archaeology/library if available.

This report also contains maps of the locations of the HER records. There are three forms of mapping available:

Modern Maps with HER Records

The maps will show the location of all the sites in the report, labelled with the WSM number. **Please note:** The labels only give the approximate location of the sites and monuments. The reason for this is that if there is more than one record for a location or there are lots of sites in close proximity – i.e. on a street of historic houses – then the labels overlies each other and cannot be read. We, therefore, move or adjust the labels very slightly to make them easier to see. To get the precise location you must use the grid reference. The HER is set up with a number of themes or layers. Each theme contains a different type of record e.g. Historic Buildings or Excavations.

This allows us to switch the various themes on and off to look at different types of record separately. The various themes are colour coded to make them easily identifiable and can be seen within the legend of each map.

Historic Maps

We can supply copies of Landmark Digital mapping based on 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Edition Ordnance Survey maps. These are drawn from several maps and are referred to as Epochs not Editions. It is important to note that Copyright restrictions mean that they must **not** be used in any report and are for research purposes only.

GIS Shape Files

If you have access to a GIS system we can provide site location data as ESRI shapefiles for your own use as an alternative to the aforementioned mapping. This is the best way of sending and receiving complex spatial information. In built up areas where there are a large number of records, the data will be sent out in several files. We will provide site location data as individually themed shape files for each type of record.

Glossary of commonly used terms

AS: The unique number given to each aerial photograph referenced in the HER

Cropmarks: The visible effect of arable crops caused by the presence of below ground historic environment features

HER: Historic Environment Record

HWCM (Herefordshire and Worcestershire County Monument): Unique number given to each HER Record during the period Herefordshire and Worcestershire had a joint County Council. Superseded by WSM.

Monument: an archaeological site either showing as visible remains on the ground or a below ground site revealed by, for example, aerial photography or geophysical survey

National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF): The full statement of the Government's planning policies, including those on the conservation of the historic environment. It replaces Planning Policy Statement 5: Planning for the Historic Environment (PPS5).

Palaeochannels: ancient silted up river channels, or other watercourses that are often associated with well-preserved organic remains and historic environment features

Palaeo-environmental: Organic remains associated with past landscapes. Such deposits can reveal information about climate, the types of fauna and flora in a landscape and past human activity

Ridge and furrow: large-scale earthworks associated with former medieval and post-medieval open-field communal farming that appear as a distinctive corrugated surface

SWR: The unique number given to each report, document, map etc

WCC: Worcestershire County Council

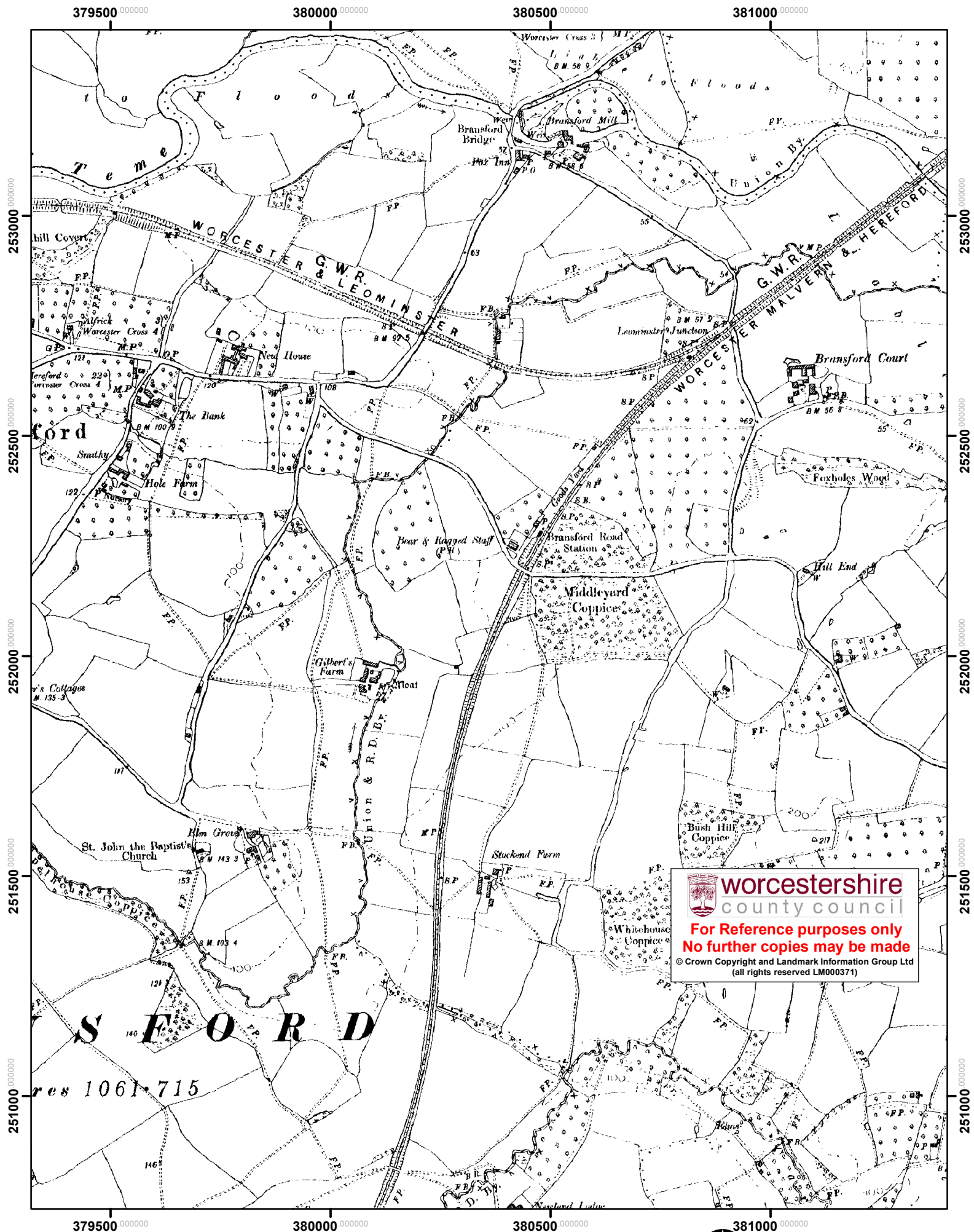
WSM (Worcestershire Sites and Monuments): The unique number given to each monument, building and archaeological event recorded in the HER.

The beginning and end of certain periods is a contentious issue. In the HER, the following dates are used. This is a standard convention across all HERs.

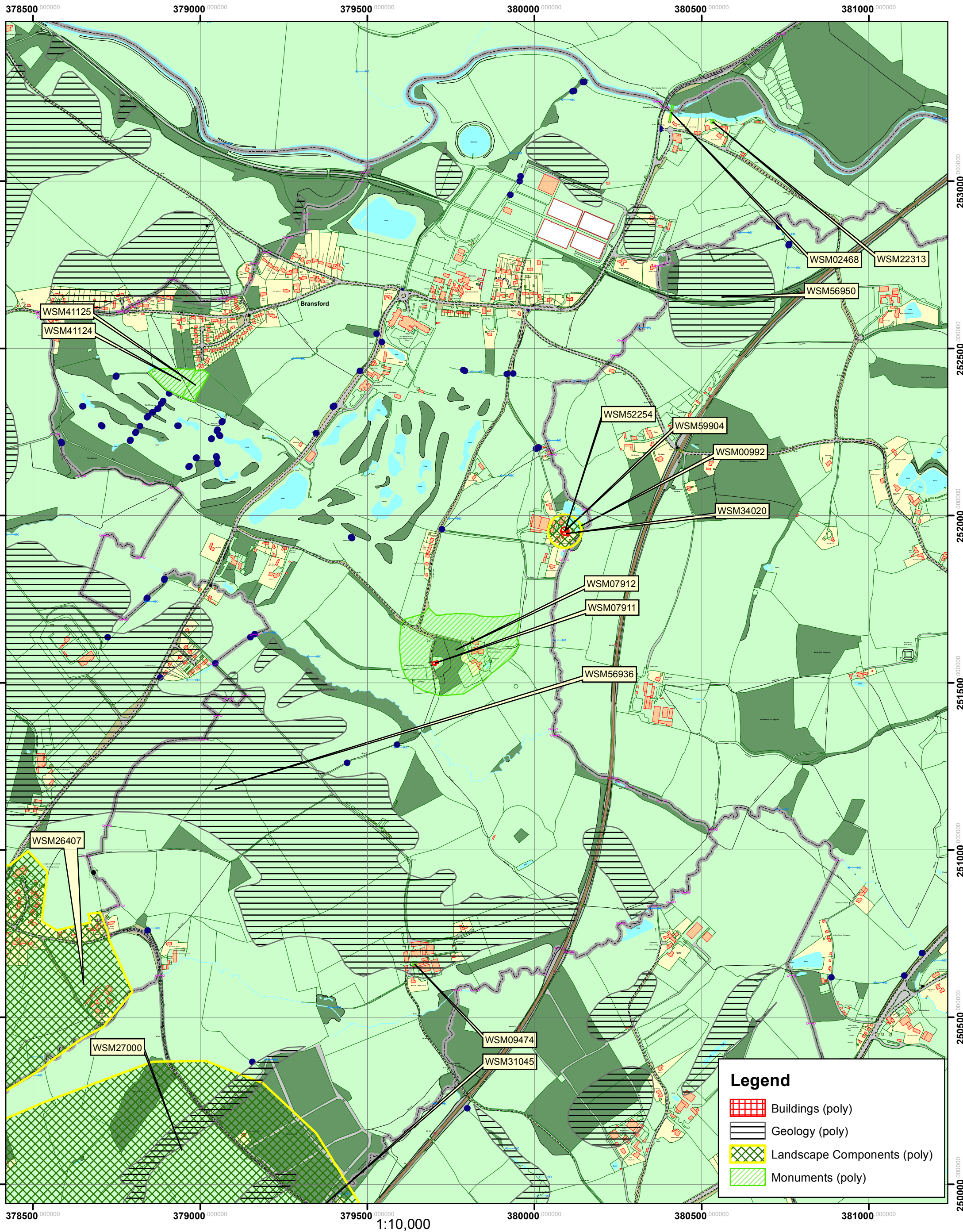

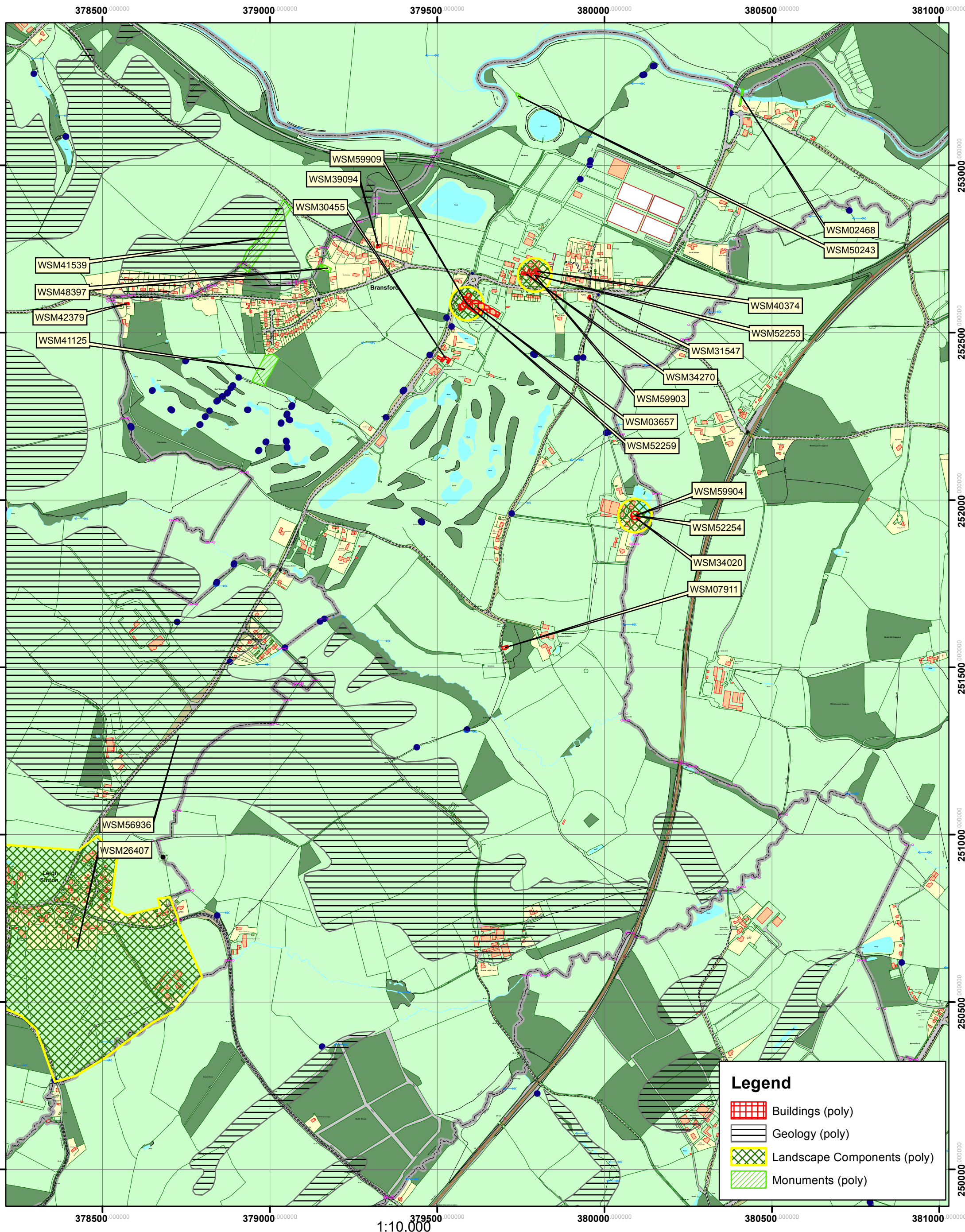


HER Heritage Assets in the Parish of Bransford; Palaeolithic through to Medieval Period



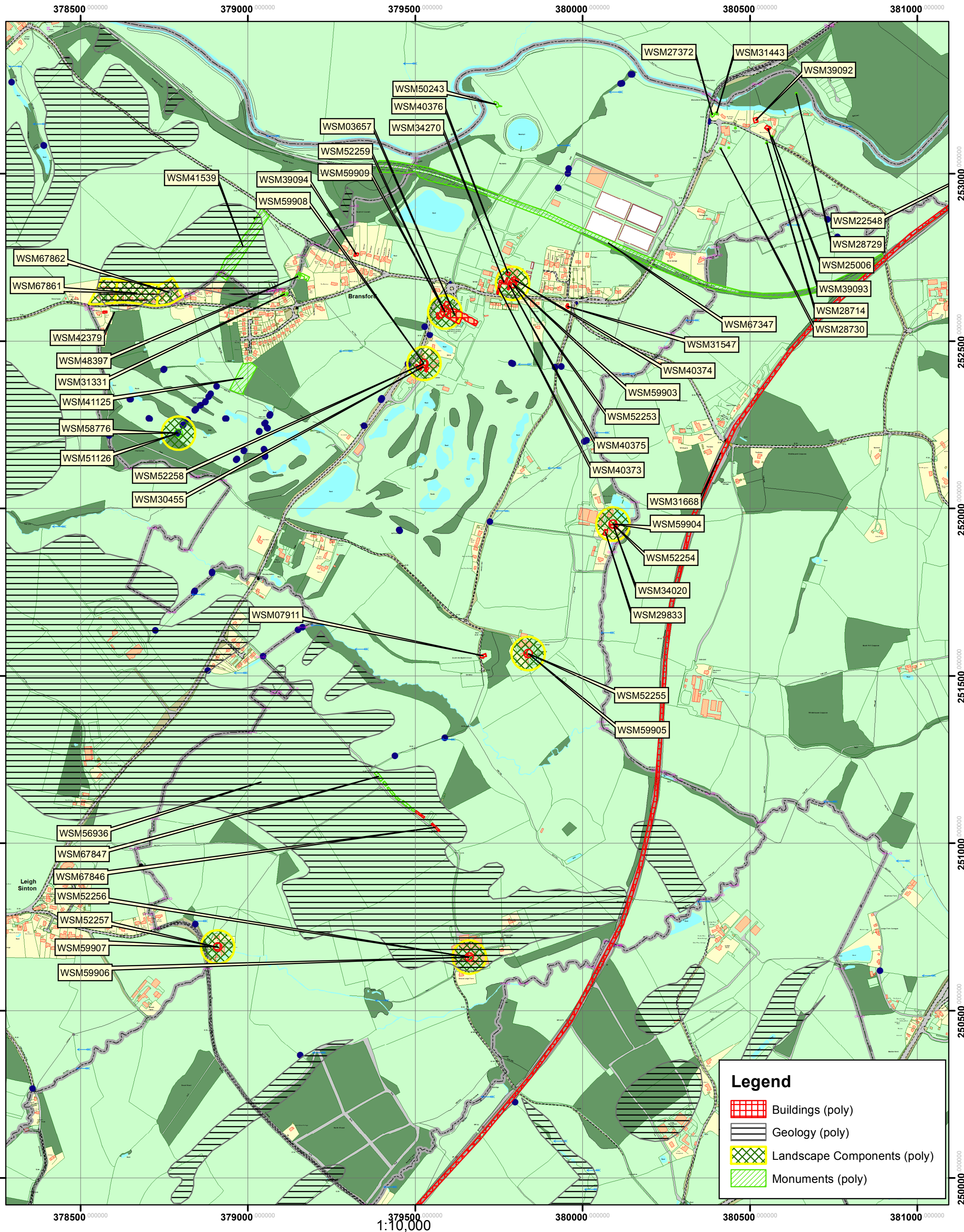


HER Heritage Assets in the Parish of Bransford; Late 16th through to 18th Century





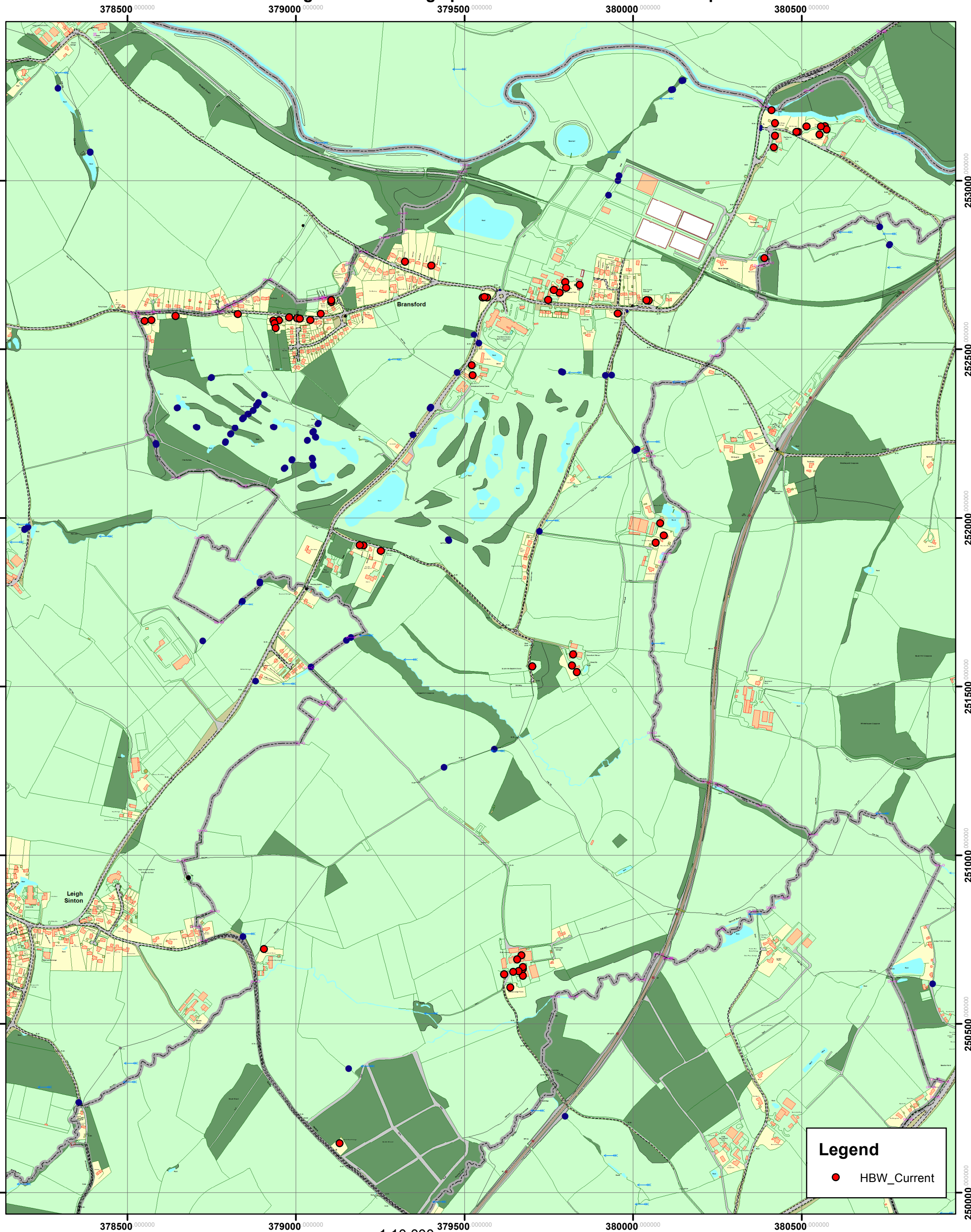
HER Heritage Assets in the Parish of Bransford; 19th and 20th Centuries



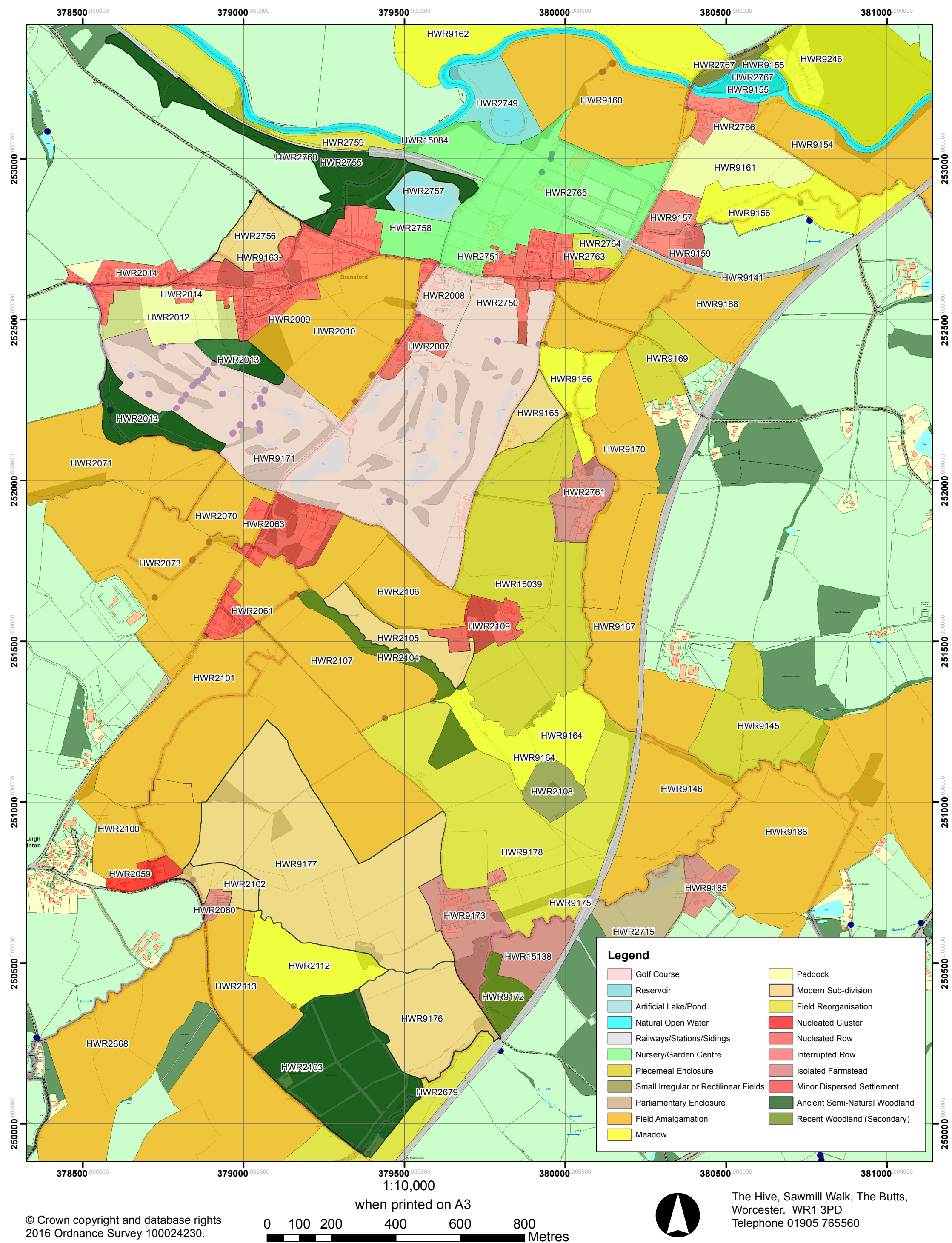

Wulstan de Bransford created a stone five arch bridge in 1338 to replace an earlier timber structure. During the Civil War four of the arches were destroyed and replaced with timber decking until replaced by iron girders carrying a wooden deck in 1900. In 1925 the old bridge was replaced by another 50 yards upstream [2].

Clause 8 of the Cotheridge Charter S.1303/B.1106 refers to this location as Brngnesford. Grundy provides a translation under B.1106 ([3], p.62) and Hooke under s.1303/B.1106 ([4], p.258). Details of the charter can also be found in Finberg under F.284 ([5], p.110) and in Sawyer under S.1303 - Grants by bishops [6].

Original bridge said to have been built by Walter de Bransford, Prior of Worcester, who held office from 1317 to 1338 when he became bishop. Four arches were owned by the Bransford Estate of the Earl of Beauchamp, the sole Cotheridge arch is much the oldest. The Bransford arches were broken down in the civil War, the road is now carried over by iron girders [7]

A lean-to brick extension has been added to the west end of the building with a pantile roof. The north elevation has a rectangular window with a blocked door next to it and a rectangular three-light window in the brick extension. The south elevation has two doors, two small rectangular windows and a larger elongated window. The brick extension also has a rectangular window. The upper panels have painted decoration on them. The east elevation has two windows and tension braces. The v-struts at the apex of the gable have angled brick infill. The west elevation is partly covered by the brick extension (Plate 4) which is attached to the tie-beam of the truss. The framing above this is similar to that of the east elevation. A window sits between the tie beam and the collar and the v-struts also have angled brick infill. [8]
